Journey of a Poet: The Agony and the Ecstasy of G. M. Hopkins written by Rev. Dr. V. Y. Dasappan, S.J., Principal, St. Xavier's College, Thumba, Thiruvananthapuram was released at Loyola College on 18.02.19. Releasing the book, Rev. Fr.
