17. CASE STUDY

A dispute arose between the two parties regarding the hiring charges for the taxi. The customer was willing to pay a higher amount than what he had agreed to pay, but he did not want to pay at the rate of Rs 30 per kilometer. He argued that latter was an exorbitant rate.
