COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

The community Development specialization students eight of them went to Ankur Kala at

9.30am. Prof. John Jeyakumar accompanied the CD students.

1. ANKUR KALA

Purpose: Handicraft training to Destitute women.

Aims/Objective/Mission:

The meaning of Ankur kala is "Seeds of Hope". The target group is destitute and

marginalized women and children in urban as well as in rural areas in West Bengal.

The Ankur Kala model focuses more on training these women to become self-reliant instead of finding them dole money to carry them through their shameful lives. Its 'training for empowerment' and finally 'rehabilitation' of the marginal and destitute rural and semi-urban women through entrepreneurship development programmes, rightfully aimed at instilling self confidence and dignity to their lives, thus enabling them to stand up to economic and social exploitation. The training is given through various departments as per the interest of choosing the area of work. There the students got direct exposure visit to Handicraft training institute.

2. INSTITUTE OF SOCIAL WORK

Purpose: Women's issues

Aim/Objective/Mission:

The organisation aims to reform the social condition of the poor and neglected section of our society especially the women who have always been the oppressed ones in the rural areas. It aims to achieve this through mobilization of its awareness and orientation programmes. These programmes provide economic independence for women so that they can fight for their rights and receive proper education and training to make their life more meaningful.

MEDICAL AND PSYCHIATRY

1. ANTAGARAM HOSPITAL

It is purely a rehabilitation center situated at Govandapuram, Kolkata. It is registered under West Bengal Societies Act. The services rendered include the ever-increasing complexities of modern life are creating more problems for the human mind than it can cope with. Mental illness, including addiction and alcoholism, is assuming greater proportions as challenging social problems. Antara is a response to this challenge.

It strives to extend a helping hand to the mentally-distressed in ways more than one. the services tendered by the Antara Society are - Psychiatric inpatient treatment and rehabilitation through pharmaco-therapy, psychotherapy, occupational and aesthetic therapy, Psychiatric and general medical outpatient consultation, medication, counseling and guidance services, Community mental health outreach through satellite clinics in rural areas, and Education and training in various mental health domains in schools and the community.

Objectives:

- To run a voluntary association of social workers and psychiatrists for the purpose of assisting, rehabilitating and treating the mentally disturbed...irrespective of caste, colour or creed.
- To provide outdoor, indoor and domiciliary treatment to the mentally ill, including alcoholics and drug addicts.

- To establish in Kolkata and elsewhere centres and branches for expansion of the activities of the association

MEDICAL AND PSYCHIATRY

1. NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF BEHAVIOURAL SCIENCE (NIBS)

National Institute of Behavioural Sciences is a voluntary organization (NGO), registered under West Bengal Societies Registration Act 1961 since 1989. We are involved in health related activities pertaining to psychological as well as physical.

NIBS has been running outdoor patient clinics for the treatment of mentally sick patients and the drug dependents, at 7 & 8 CIT Road, Kolkata - 700014 (near Moulali). The clinic provides services six days a week. A team of competent psychiatrists, psychologists, general physicians, neurologists, special educator, dietician and social workers run the outdoor clinic. Besides, NIBS also carries on

regular rural mental health camps in Rangabelia, a remote and marooned locality in Sunderbans Delta of West Bengal, India.

Vision and mission:

To render complete mental health care to all sections of the society with special stress of the poor ones, slow learning students, teachers and those who feel themselves in absolute solitude.

Management:

- Psychological counseling (both individual and group sessions) to help the sports people to come out from their problems and to enable them to cope up existing reality, in turn, to assist to help them to perform their level best.
- Behaviour therapy (practicing relaxation, using bio feedback techniques and other psychotherapeutic aids).
- Psychological counseling and guidance to all the coaches (group sessions and individual sessions).
- Periodic workshop on psychotherapeutic intervention and utilization of psychological aids.
