The students of the Social work Department are engaged in an educational tour to expose them to National level agencies in their specialization. This National Social Work Perspective is to have an exposure to national level organizations, provide an idea and opportunity for job placement through block placement. This vital part of their curriculum through which students not only earn a credit but are also get an opportunity to familiarize themselves with the working of reputed agencies and organizations.

GENERAL OBJECTIVES:

- To create a feeling of oneness among the students through group living and informal interactions and to understand the importance of social relationships.
- To get exposed to Socio- Economic and Cultural diversities, value systems that exist in the country.
- To develop networking skills and connect with Social Work Professional within the country.
- To get an understanding about the functioning of different successful organizations.
- To acquire professional competence in decision making, planning, implementation, monitoring and reviewing.

TOUR PROCESS:

Students form various committees and are directly responsible for selection of places of visit, budgeting, obtaining prior permission, drafting of schedules and arranging travel & accommodation. To facilitate the students in this process two faculty extend their guidance and supervision.

OBJECTIVES OF THE COMMON & SPECIALIZATION VISITS:

General Objectives:

- To provide an opportunity to students to gain an insight into a working environment related to the subject area.
- To help students develop their communication and inter- personal skills in the context of professional social work.

Community Development:

- To acquire knowledge on the administrative structure and staffing pattern.
- To understand the aims, objectives, mission and vision of the organization.
- To learn about the welfare activities and benefits carried out for the target group.
- To get an exposure in the field of fund mobilization and utilization.

Human Resource Management:

To acquire knowledge on the organizational activities, with specific reference to:

- Organizational Culture and Hierarchy
- Manufacturing Process (if any)
- HR Policies
- Industrial and Employee Relations
- Welfare Measures and activities
- Retention Strategies.

Medical & Psychiatry:

- To understand the relationship of the agency with its clients.
- To gain knowledge on effective social work practices in the field of Health and Mental Health.
- To enable the students to understand the socio- cultural realities associated with patient care.
- To learn how to identify mental disorders and how to effectively care for patients.

CHANNELS OF COMMUNICATION:

The elected Tour Leaders will be the point of coordination between the faculty, committee leaders and students. The tour leaders, committee leaders along with the Faculty form the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee is expected to once a week and will be chaired by the Faculty in charge. Every meeting of the students is expected to be chaired by the Faculty. The leaders are required to update the students on the progress of the various committees.

Identify and communicate with relevant organizations for Common & Specialization visits. The committee is responsible to prepare a schedule that balances education and relaxation. The committee is also required to ensure the punctuality of the members in attending the visits and daily review meetings.

funds for various purposes. They are responsible for the collection of money and the various expenses at every stage of the tour. The Leader is expected to record all transactions and

accordingly update the Executive Committee and students on the Financial Status.
